

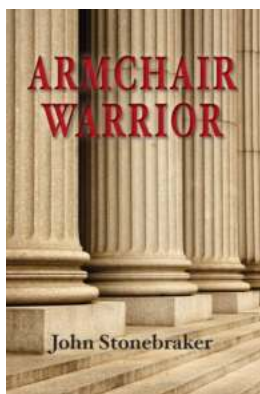

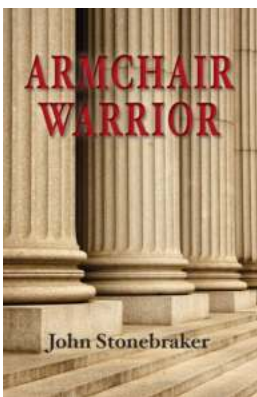

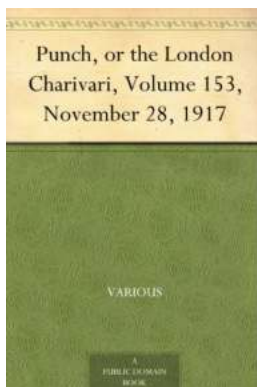

Some biases will be shattered and others reinforced, but the reader interested in the law and lawyers will not fail to learn much in every chapter.



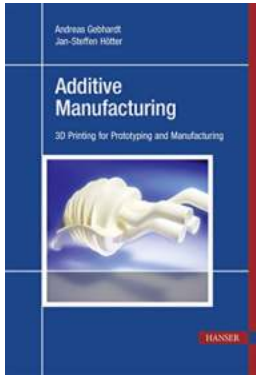
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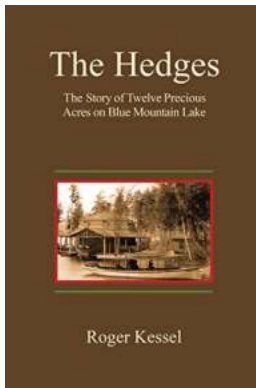
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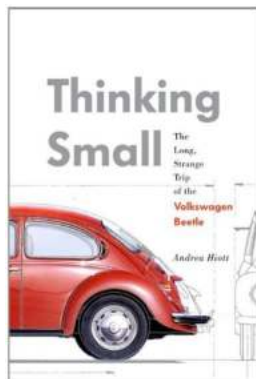
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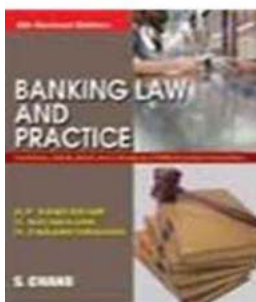
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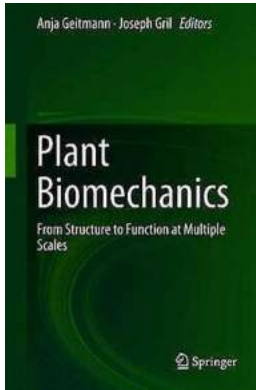
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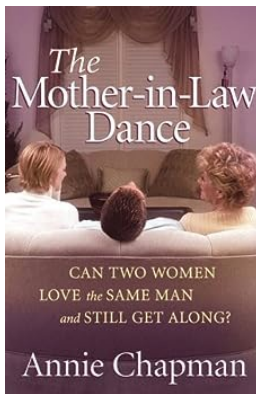
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
