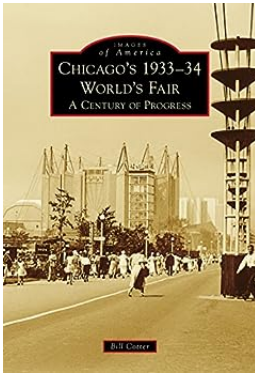
In 1984, the city of New Orleans hosted the last world's fair held in the United States.

While most world's fairs lose money, the 1984 New Orleans World's Fair had the dubious distinction of going bankrupt and almost closing early. However, the \$350-million investment did succeed in bringing new life to the area, which is now home to the city's convention center and a bustling arts district.
