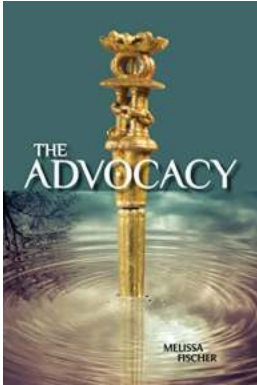

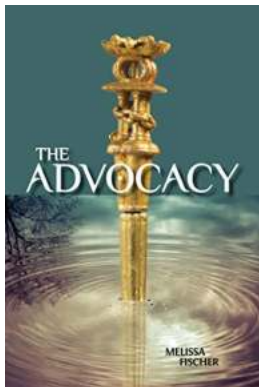

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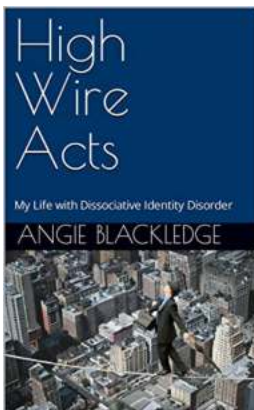

provides a rare and intimate view of a broad cross-section of Ghanaian society and the inner workings of a multinational mining corporation.

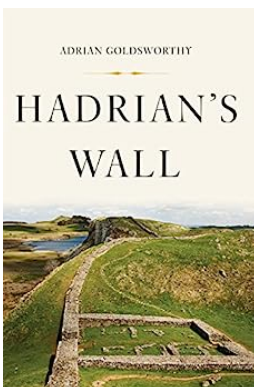
