This book will help you form sentences with some of the words we have learnt in volume one, and the ones we just learnt.



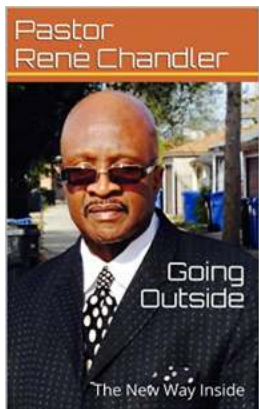
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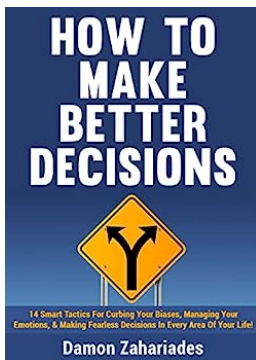
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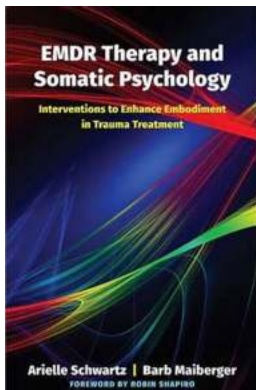
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
