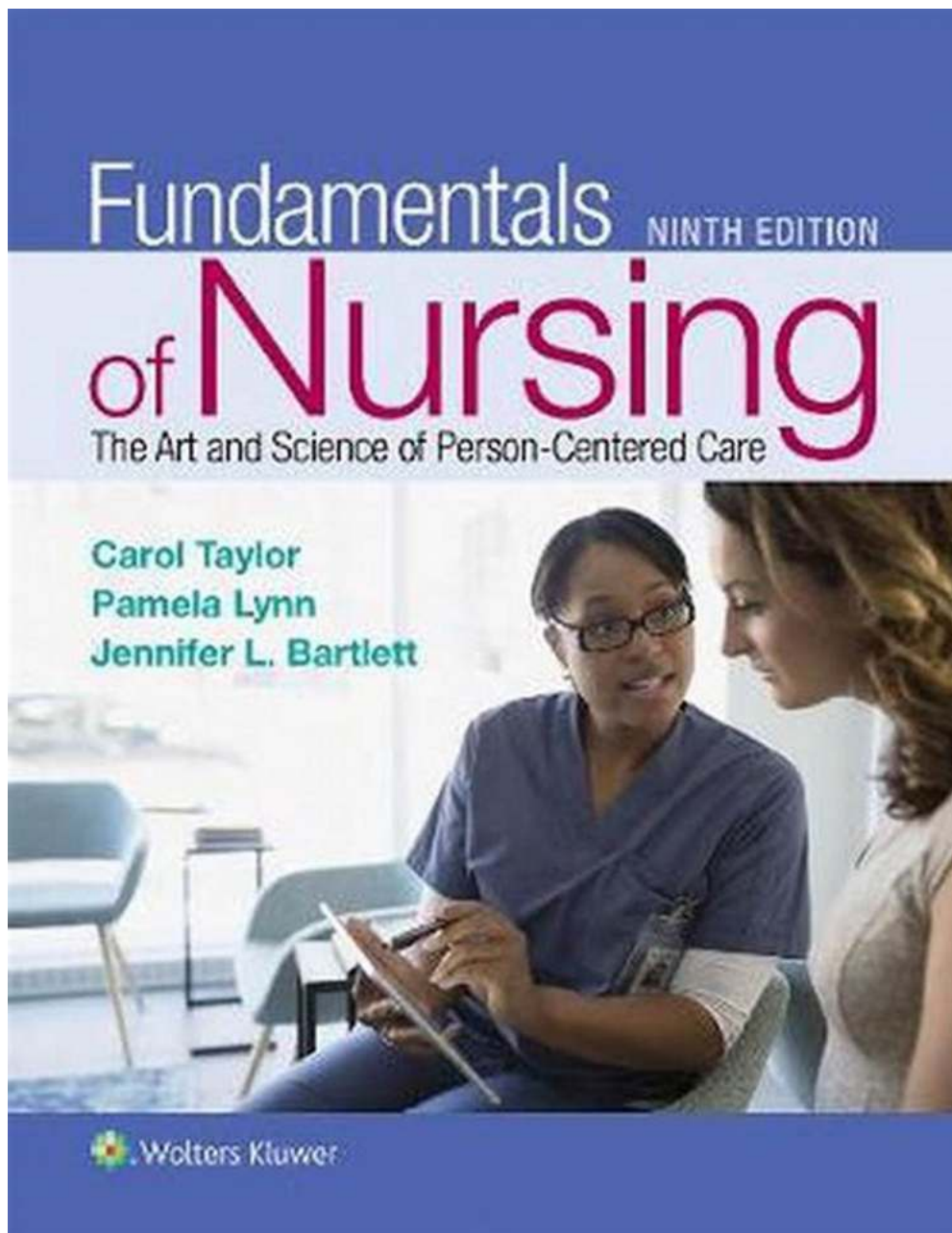

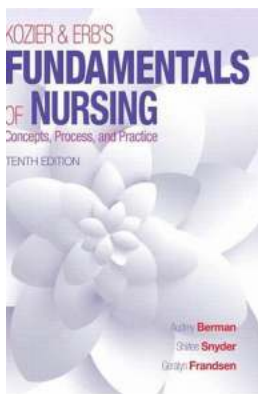

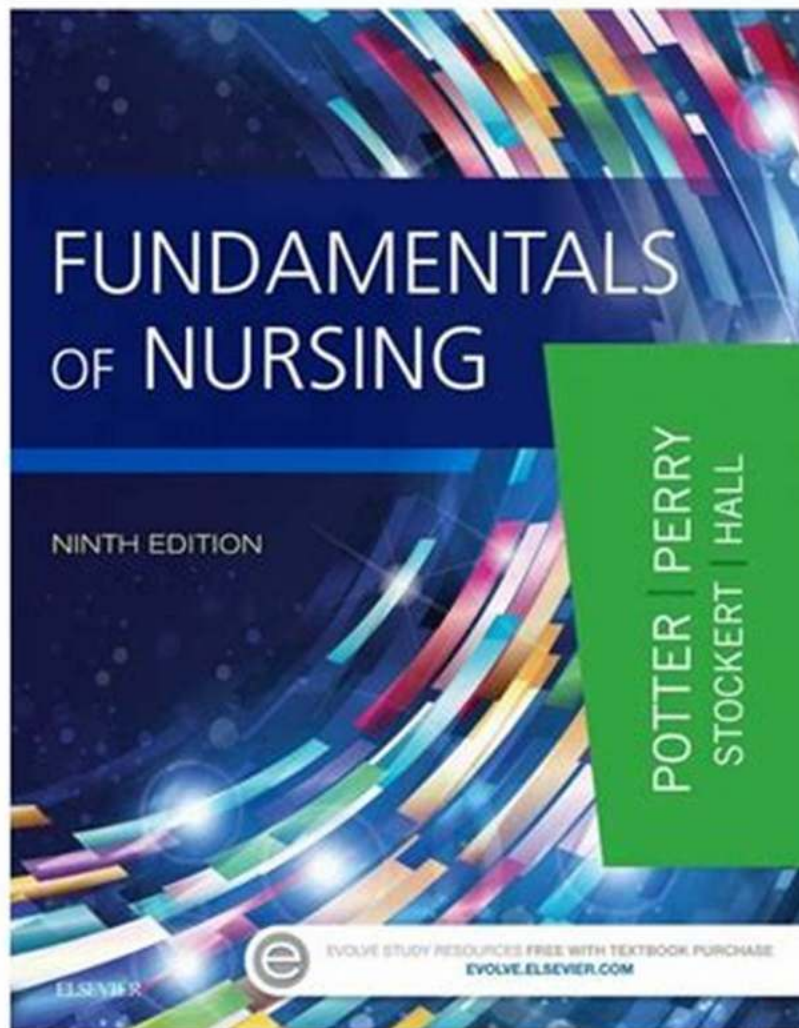

  - Does the medication label match the MAR?
  - Verify the drug's expiration date.
  - If the drug is unfamiliar, consult a drug guide or a pharmacist.
- 2** The right dose
  - Is this the dose the physician ordered?
  - Perform any necessary conversions or calculations.
  - If you need to cut or crush the medication, check with a pharmacist or a drug guide first.
- 3** The right route
  - Can this medication be given by the route ordered?
  - If giving an injection, verify that the preparation is for parenteral use.
- 4** The right time
  - Is it time for you to give the medication?
- 5** The right patient
  - Was the medication ordered for this patient?
  - Use two identifiers to confirm that you have the right patient.
- 6** The right documentation
  - Document on the appropriate record immediately after giving the medication.
  - If you did not give the medication, indicate on the MAR and document in the nurses' notes the reason you did not give it.
